• Exhaust ALL American Resources first.

Who should I research?

- Do NOT just research your immigrant ancestor
  - o Research their children
  - o Research their grandchildren
  - Anyone else in the community who speaks the same language
    - Use the Census records to assist you.

Gather EVERYTHING

- Every Census
- Every Birth/Death Certificate for them AND anyone else who might give you a clue
  - o Check the FamilySearch Research Wiki for approximate dates these records are available
    - www.familysearch.org/wiki/en/Main\_Page
- Every Newspaper article
  - Newspapers.com
  - o Newspaper Archive
  - o <u>chroniclingamerica.loc.gov/</u>
  - <u>news.google.com/newspapers</u>
  - Every scrap of paper with their names(!)
    - Photographs, Letters, Journals, Recipes, etc.
- Church Records
  - o Many immigrants brought the means to transfer into a church from their homeland
  - Some records note where new members originated
  - o www.familysearch.org/wiki/en/United States Church Records
- School Records
  - o Some records note where new students originated
  - o Teacher notes might mention country or town of origin
  - Ancestry (3 filters)
    - Schools, Directories & Church Histories
    - School Lists & Yearbooks
    - USA
    - You can then narrow to your area
  - o <u>www.familysearch.org</u>
    - Catalog
    - United States
    - Places within the United States
  - o Local repositories for area where ancestor lived

- Google
  - Search for others researching the same family
  - Search for the names you might find overseas records.
