- County
- Province
- Barony
- Diocese
- Parish
- Townland (smallest land division)

Finding a Place of Origin in Ulster

- Gold standard is to find the parish and townland very difficult
- More difficult for 18th century Irish immigrants
- Few church records in America in 18th century, and virtually none of them list places of origin
- If the name is unusual, check later enumerations, such as Griffith's Valuation from the 1847-64 (may be too late for most Scots-Irish American families)
- Tithe Applotment List, 1823-1838
- Check Freeholder's records on PRONI website
- Check Belfast Newsletter for references to surname

Belfast Newsletter research

- Vital record notices
- Advertisements
- Land sales
- Criminal notices
- Runaways

Problem of Scots-Irish Name Variants

- Consider all possible ways of spelling
- Vowel shifts, ie. Pollock vs. Polk vs. Poag vs. Poak
- Changes can happen over generations of same family
- O and Mac can be dropped from names, O'Donnell vs. Donnell
- Anglicized Irish names into English
- Studies of surname distribution can help

William Roulston's Research Scots-Irish Ancestors

- Best and most definitive guide
- Church records list for Ulster best in print
- Local histories bibliography comprehensive
- Lists of landed estate papers by parish and family

- Archives and libraries listing
- Maps
- Good overviews of all other archival sources for Ulster

Church Records in Ulster

- Church of Ireland (Anglican)
- Presbyterian (various sects)
- Methodist
- Roman Catholic (not as strong in North as in Republic)
- Moravian (Gracehill and Ballinderry, County Antrim)
- Religious Society of Friends (Quakers)
- Huguenots (at Lisburn, County Antrim)

Strategies for Finding Ulster Church Records

- Some were lost in the 1922 Public Record Office fire in Dublin
- Those that survive are often incomplete
- Many births, marriages, and deaths occurred in Ulster not recorded in church records
- Always search neighboring parishes for baptisms

Miscellaneous Sources

- Muster rolls 1630
- 1641 Depositions
- Down Survey 1650s (maps with some landowners)
- Hearth money rolls
- Censuses (fragments) and 1796 Flax Premium list
- Deeds
- Landed estate records
- Wills
- Cemeteries
- Genealogists' papers and transcripts

Deeds

- Extant from 1709 not all were recorded
- All digitized by Familysearch, searchable online
- Grantor indexes online
- Original deeds at Registry of Deeds in Dublin
- Many deeds are leases, not land transfers
- Terms of lease often for three named lives
- Much incidental information

Types of Irish Deeds

- Leases (most common)
- Land sales and transfers
- Annuities and Mortgages

- Marriage settlements (prenuptial agreements)
- Wills (occasionally)

Deed Arrangement

- Book Page Memorial number
- Grantor index (no grantee index)
- Town and townland index

Landed Estate Records

- Correspondence
- Leases not otherwise recorded in Registry of Deeds
- Rent books
- Estate maps
- Search for the land owners in the areas where your family lived
- Manuscripts at PRONI and National Library of Ireland
- Hayes Manuscript and Periodical Sources for Irish Research

Wills

- Diocesan wills (filed by diocese)
- Prerogative wills
- Indexes survive
- Most originals destroyed in 1922 fire
- Abstracts and copies exist for many
- Betham's Abstracts of Prerogative Wills

An important source for residents of Ulster in this period.
- Betham, Sir William. "Betham Genealogical Abstracts" and "Betham Prerogative Marriage Licences Abstracts." Find My Past website. Searchable collections of abstracted prerogative wills and marriage bonds made before the 1922 fire. https://search.findmypast.com/search-world-Records/betham-genealogical-abstracts

- Down Survey of Ireland. 1656-1658. Trinity College Dublin. Database with images <downsurvey.tcd.ie> Detailed land ownership maps from 1656 to 1658. Only large landowners shown.
- Flax Growers List [Spinning Wheel Premium Entitlement List] 1796. [Known under various titles, with several versions online]. See Familysearch for index and images. DGS no. 8088598. Lists of persons to whom premiums were paid for growing flax in 1796.

- Freeholders Records, Pre-1840. Index and images, Public Record Office of Northern Ireland (PRONI). https://www.nidirect.gov.uk/proni Lists of males taken from polls books who had the right to vote based on their land holdings. It includes some lists from the 1760s forward and is an important census substitute.
- GENUKI. https://www.genuki.org.uk/ Useful links to many towns and counties
- Grenham, John. *Irish Ancestors* website. <johngrenham.com> Contains excellent record lists by county with links to some online records.
- Griffith's Valuation of Ireland, 1847-1864. Available on Find My Past and Ancestry. Lists are too late for most Americans with Scots Irish ancestors, but it may provide clues about the locations of certain family names.
